

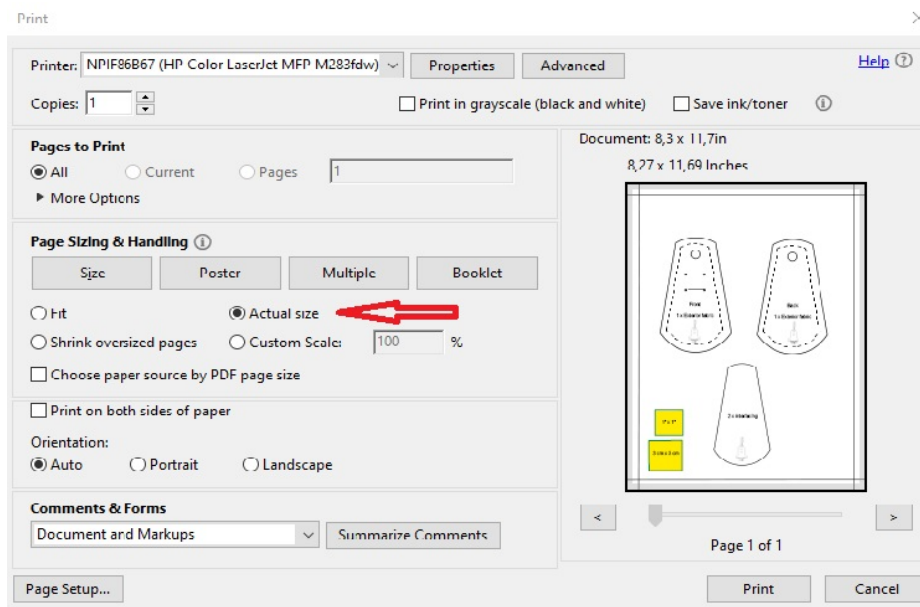
Bag dangling - Glasses holder



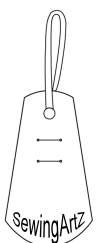
Difficulty: For beginners

Finished size: 10 cm (4") H x 5 cm (2") W

Fabric recommendation: Faux leather, leather, fur etc, but no materials which fray.



You can print out pattern in DIN A4. Make sure "actual size" is set and then check the 3 cm or 1" inch test square to make sure the correct size has printed.





Materials:
approx. 12 cm (5") x 12 cm (5") faux leather, leather, cork etc
1 x 8 mm ($\frac{5}{16}$ ") hole punch
1 Eyelet size 8
1 Carabiner (with 10 mm opening (0,4"))
1 x Double cap rivet size 8
10 cm (4") x 10 cm (4") Decovil Light (optional)



1. Take the front panel and punch the holes at the markings.



2. Cut the lines between the holes.



3. Lay the front and the back panel wrong sides together and clip everything in place.



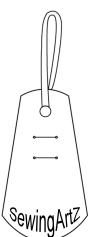
4. Sew both parts together with a seam allowance of 6 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ ").



5. Now trim back the seam allowance to 3 mm ($\frac{1}{8}$ ").



6. Color the sides with edge color if you like.





7. Take a 8 mm ($\frac{5}{16}$ ") hole punch and set the hole for the eyelet at the marking of the front panel



8. Cut a strip 20 cm (8") H x 0,75 cm (0,3") W and punch 3 holes for the rivets. 2 of them at the the beginning and the end of the strip, another one 3 cm (1") from one of the other holes.



9. Threads the carabiner onto the strip and sets the rivet (see pictures 9 and 10).

Congratulations you did it!
